THE CAUSE OF COLOR IN YOUR GRAYISH YELLOWISH GREEN DIAMOND

Grayish Yellowish Green diamonds exhibit an unbelievable behavior for a diamond, as can be understood from their nickname; dramatically changing their stable color when heated or placed in darkness. Much like the mythical moonflower, which blooms at night and returns to its normal state by dawn, this transformative quality derives its value not from traditional color grades or modifiers, but from its unique ability to transform. Collectors should know that their diamonds will exhibit a different color when placed undisturbed in a safe.



A WORD ABOUT THE SATURATION OF YOUR DIAMOND

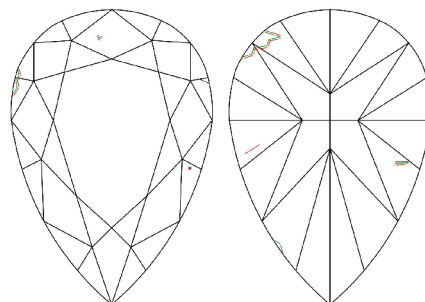
The **"Deep"** grade exhibits an extremely saturated color with a darker tone. This grade represents only **21%** of all Grayish Yellowish Green diamonds. Fancy "Deep" Grayish Yellowish Green diamonds give a profound color sensation.

There are Six available saturation levels in Green color diamonds, Fancy Deep being the Five most saturated. Fancy Deep is as saturated as Vivid; however, it presents a darker tone.

THE FUNDAMENTALS OF THIS DIAMOND'S SHAPE

The **Pear** brilliant cut diamond is a classic shape that appeared in jewelry as early as the 17th century on nobles and royalty. The facet alignment on the pavilion is inspired by the classic Round brilliant, hence the name of this shape. Only **43%** from all Grayish Yellowish Green fancy color diamonds are polished as Pear shape.



TRUE FACE-UP

The carat weight and physical size of a diamond are important factors in determining its value. However, when it comes to fancy colored diamonds, there is a tendency to prioritize other visual elements over their size, and as a result, the surface area of the face-up view is not always given high priority. Diamonds that appear slightly smaller are considered to be within the norm. However, diamonds that appear larger in relation to their weight will receive a premium.

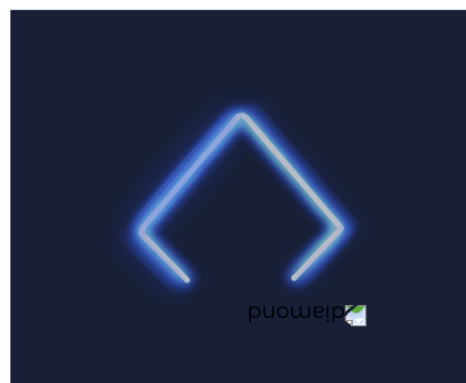
THE SI1 CLARITY IN THIS FANCY DEEP GRAYISH YELLOWISH GREEN DIAMOND

Grayish Yellowish Green Fancy Color Diamonds are extremely rare in nature and achieve their value from their captivating color. Unlike in colorless diamonds, the impact of a **SI1** clarity in Grayish Yellowish Green fancy color diamonds is negligible as long as it is not visible to the naked eye. A Fancy Deep Grayish Yellowish Green with a SI1 clarity grade represents 25% of all Fancy Deep Grayish Yellowish Green diamonds in the 1 - 1.49 carat weight category.

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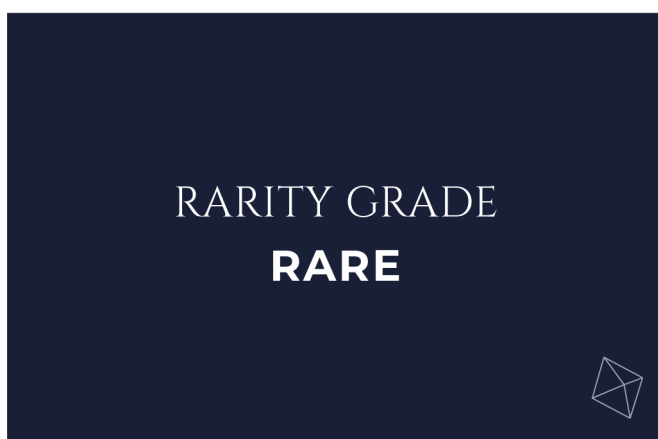
THE STRONG BLUE FLUORESCENT IN THIS DIAMOND

Fluorescence refers to the emission of visible light when a diamond is exposed to UV light. The fluorescence in this diamond is caused by the presence of trace elements within the lattice of the diamond. When a diamond is exposed to UV light, these elements absorb the energy from the UV light. They become excited, and as a result, release energy in the form of a Blue glow. A **Strong Blue** Fluorescence can sometimes be seen under a direct sunlight and may temporarily weaken the saturation of this 1 carat diamond.

- Only **1 in ~ 470,000** diamonds will have similar characteristics
- A mere **3 to 6** similar diamonds enter the market yearly
