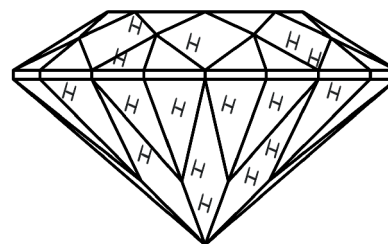

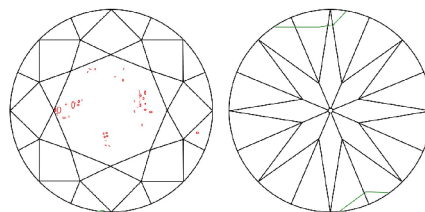

THE FUNDAMENTALS OF THIS DIAMOND'S SHAPE

Your 2.04 carat **round** brilliant cut diamond is cut and polished with the same facet alignment and an angle of colorless diamonds. fancy color **round** diamonds do not retain color the way modified fancy shapes do and as such, are rarely seen in weights above 0.10 carat. **round** fancy color diamonds in the Intense or Vivid grade fetch a significant premium in comparison to similar diamonds in other shapes. TRUE FACE-UP

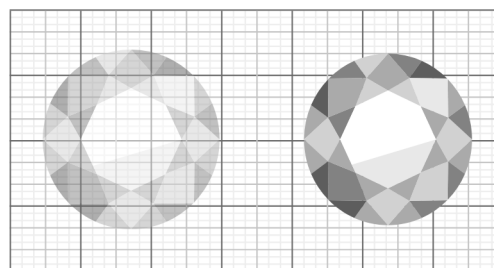
The carat weight and physical size of a diamond are important factors in determining its value. However, when it comes to fancy colored diamonds, there is a tendency to prioritize other visual elements over their size, and as a result, the surface area of the face-up view is not always given high priority. Diamonds that appear slightly smaller are considered to be within the norm. However, diamonds that appear larger in relation to their weight will receive a premium.

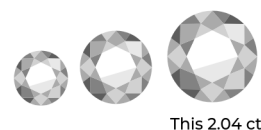

THE SI2 CLARITY IN THIS FANCY GRAY DIAMOND

Gray Fancy Color Diamonds are extremely rare in nature and achieve their value from their captivating color. Unlike colorless diamonds, the impact of low clarity in Gray fancy color diamonds is negligible as long as it is not visible to the naked eye. A Fancy Gray with a **SI2** clarity represents 4% of all Fancy Gray diamonds in the 2 - 2.99 carat weight category.

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THE MEDIUM BLUE FLUORESCENT IN THIS DIAMOND

Fluorescence refers to the emission of visible light when a diamond is exposed to UV light. The fluorescence in this diamond is caused by the presence of trace elements within the lattice of the diamond. When a diamond is exposed to UV light, these elements absorb the energy from the UV light. They become excited, and as a result, release energy in the form of a Blue glow. The **Medium Blue** fluorescence has very little to almost no impact on the quality of this 2.04 carat diamond. In order to view the fluorescent glow, one must use a special UV device.



HOW RARE IS THIS 2.04 CARAT?

- Only **1 in ~ 20,000,000** diamonds will have similar characteristics
- A similar diamond enters the market once every **10 To 11 years**
