THE CAUSE OF COLOR IN YOUR GREEN YELLOW DIAMOND

Yellow color in diamonds is attributed to the presence of nitrogen atoms that absorb blue light in the visible spectrum. Green diamonds derive their color from the absorption of red light waves. In your diamond, subterranean radiation exposure altered its atomic structure leading to the absorption of red light by its molecules and the emergence of its distinctive color.



A WORD ABOUT THE SATURATION OF YOUR DIAMOND

The grade **"Very Light"** represents **4%** of all Green Yellow diamonds and exhibits a soft, yet visible, color. In most cases, this saturation level receives the comment 'Not Applicable' in the distribution section, as areas of color gently blend with colorless areas in the face-up view.

There are Six available saturation levels in Yellow color diamonds, Very Light being the First most saturated.

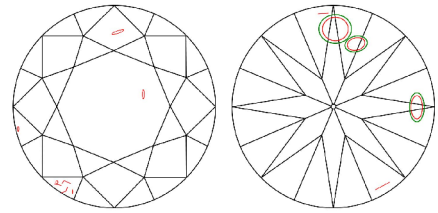

THE FUNDAMENTALS OF THIS DIAMOND'S SHAPE

Your 2.03 carat **round** brilliant cut diamond is cut and polished with the same facet alignment and an angle of colorless diamonds. fancy color **round** diamonds do not retain color the way modified fancy shapes do and as such, are rarely seen in weights above 0.10 carat. **round** fancy color diamonds in the Intense or Vivid grade fetch a significant premium in comparison to similar diamonds in other shapes. Only



TRUE FACE-UP

The carat weight and physical size of a diamond are important factors in determining its value. However, when it comes to fancy colored diamonds, there is a tendency to prioritize other visual elements over their size, and as a result, the surface area of the face-up view is not always given high priority. Diamonds that appear slightly smaller are considered to be within the norm. However, diamonds that appear larger in relation to their weight will receive a premium.

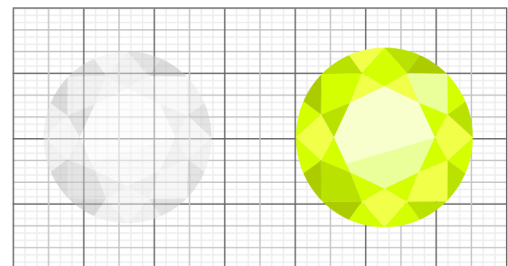

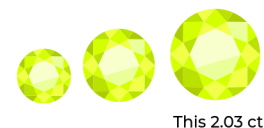

THE SI2 CLARITY IN THIS VERY LIGHT GREEN YELLOW DIAMOND

The impact of the **SI2** clarity, in a Very Light Green Yellow, Round cut, is negligible compared to colorless diamonds especially when it is not visible to the naked eye. The SI2 clarity grade represents 2% of all Very Light Green Yellow diamonds in the 2 - 2.99 carat weight category.

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THE FAINT BLUE FLUORESCENT IN THIS DIAMOND

Fluorescence refers to the emission of visible light when a diamond is exposed to UV light. The fluorescence in this diamond is caused by the presence of trace elements within the lattice of the diamond. When a diamond is exposed to UV light, these elements absorb the energy from the UV light. They become excited, and as a result, release energy in the form of a Blue glow. The **Faint Blue** fluorescence in this 2.03 carat has no impact on its quality. It is impossible to spot a glow of this **Faint Blue** Fluorescence in the diamond without a special UV light device.



HOW RARE IS THIS 2.03 CARAT?

- Only **1 in ~ 20,000,000** diamonds will have similar characteristics
- A similar diamond enters the market once every **8 To 12 years**
