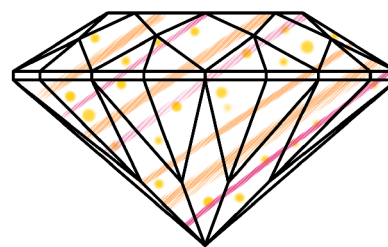

THE CAUSE OF COLOR IN YOUR BROWNISH YELLOWISH ORANGE DIAMOND

The **Orange and yellow** hues of this 1.19 carat diamond attest to the presence of nitrogen atoms that absorb blue light and create a dark yellow hue, combined with red luminescence. Diamonds with orange and brown appearance have a distinctive atomic structure that results from immense pressure that deformed their crystal lattice and led to the absorption of a broad range of colors, including purple, blue and green.

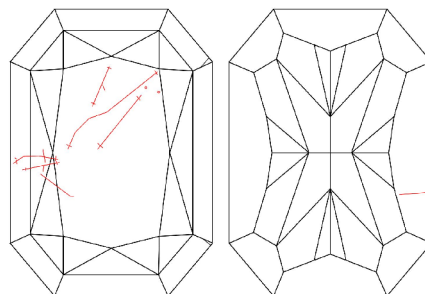
The grade '**Fancy**' represents a level with a significant presence of color and accounts for **10%** of all Brownish Yellowish Orange fancy Color diamonds.

THE FUNDAMENTALS OF THIS DIAMOND'S SHAPE

The **Radiant** cut is a square or rectangular diamond with clipped corners, usually polished with a minimum of 59 facets. The Radiant is polished with a Starburst style pavilion, inspired by a round brilliant cut diamond, hence the name of this shape. **38%** from all Brownish Yellowish Orange fancy color diamonds are polished as Cushion / Radiant.



TRUE FACE-UP

The carat weight and physical size of a diamond are important factors in determining its value. However, when it comes to fancy colored diamonds, there is a tendency to prioritize other visual elements over their size, and as a result, the surface area of the face-up view is not always given high priority. Diamonds that appear slightly smaller are considered to be within the norm. However, diamonds that appear larger in relation to their weight will receive a premium.

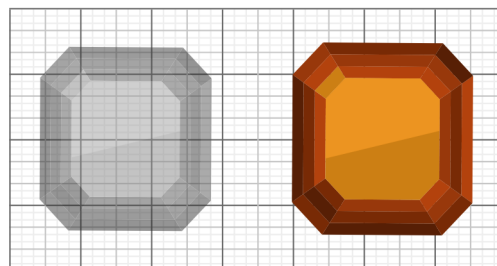

THE SI1 CLARITY IN THIS FANCY BROWNISH YELLOWISH ORANGE DIAMOND

The impact of the **SI1** clarity, in a Fancy Brownish Yellowish Orange, Radiant cut, is negligible compared to colorless diamonds especially when it is not visible to the naked eye. The SI1 clarity grade represents 29% of all Fancy Brownish Yellowish Orange diamonds in the 1 - 1.49 carat weight category.

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THE STRONG BLUE FLUORESCENT IN THIS DIAMOND

Fluorescence refers to the emission of visible light when a diamond is exposed to UV light. The fluorescence in this diamond is caused by the presence of trace elements within the lattice of the diamond. When a diamond is exposed to UV light, these elements absorb the energy from the UV light. They become excited, and as a result, release energy in the form of a Blue glow. A **Strong Blue** Fluorescence can sometimes be seen under a direct sunlight and may temporarily weaken the saturation of this 1.19 carat diamond.



HOW RARE IS THIS 1.19 CARAT?

- Only **1 in ~ 1,000,000** diamonds will have similar characteristics
- A mere **1 to 3** similar diamonds enter the market yearly
