THE CAUSE OF COLOR IN YOUR YELLOW GREEN DIAMOND

Yellow color in diamonds is attributed to the presence of nitrogen atoms that absorb blue light in the visible spectrum. Green diamonds derive their color from the absorption of red light waves. In your diamond, subterranean radiation exposure altered its atomic structure leading to the absorption of red light by its molecules and the emergence of its distinctive color.



A WORD ABOUT THE SATURATION OF YOUR DIAMOND

The grade '**Fancy**' represents a level with a significant presence of color and accounts for **24%** of all Yellow Green fancy Color diamonds.

There are Seven available saturation levels in Green color diamonds, Fancy being the Five most saturated.

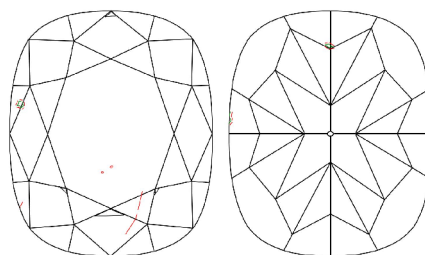

THE FUNDAMENTALS OF THIS DIAMOND'S SHAPE

The **Cushion** shape dates back to the early days when diamonds were initially made to decorate crowns of royalty. Today, the Cushion shape is still the most popular jewelry shape, and it is also yields the highest possible weight from rough diamonds. The pavilion on the bottom of your stone has a Starburst facet alignment to reinforce color reflection and brilliance. **34%** from all Yellow Green fancy color diamonds are polished as Cushion / Radiant.



TRUE FACE-UP

The carat weight and physical size of a diamond are important factors in determining its value. However, when it comes to fancy colored diamonds, there is a tendency to prioritize other visual elements over their size, and as a result, the surface area of the face-up view is not always given high priority.

Diamonds that appear slightly smaller are considered to be within the norm. However, diamonds that appear larger in relation to their weight will receive a premium.

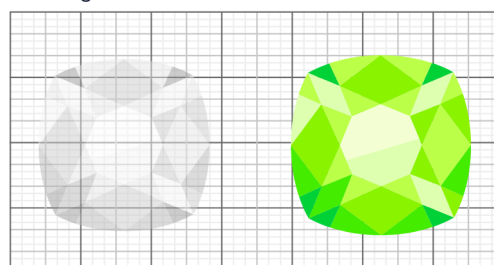

The Face-up of this 1.26 carat Cushion is equivalent to that of a **1.26 - 1.29** carat which is **~1.0% larger** than the average Cushion shape in this weight.

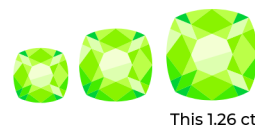

THE VS2 CLARITY IN THIS FANCY YELLOW GREEN DIAMOND

The **VS** clarity in your Fancy Yellow Green with Cushion shape cut represents only 50% of all Fancy Yellow Green diamonds in the 1 - 1.49 carat weight category.

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THE VERY STRONG BLUE FLUORESCENT IN THIS DIAMOND

Fluorescence refers to the emission of visible light when a diamond is exposed to UV light. The fluorescence in this diamond is caused by the presence of trace elements within the lattice of the diamond. When a diamond is exposed to UV light, these elements absorb the energy from the UV light. They become excited, and as a result, release energy in the form of a Blue glow. **Very Strong Blue** fluorescence can affect the translucency or color of this 1.26 carat when exposed to direct sunlight. However, in some cases, the visual effect of the fluorescence will not compromise the diamond's appearance when it is viewed indoors.



HOW RARE IS THIS 1.26 CARAT?

- Only **1 in ~ 270,000** diamonds will have similar characteristics
- A mere **5 to 10** similar diamonds enter the market yearly
