Grayish Yellowish Green diamonds exhibit an unbelievable behavior for a diamond, as can be understood from their nickname; dramatically changing their stable color when heated or placed in darkness. Much like the mythical moonflower, which blooms at night and returns to its normal state by dawn, this transformative quality derives its value not from traditional color grades or modifiers, but from its unique ability to transform. Collectors should know that their diamonds will exhibit a different color when placed undisturbed in a safe.



A WORD ABOUT THE SATURATION OF YOUR DIAMOND

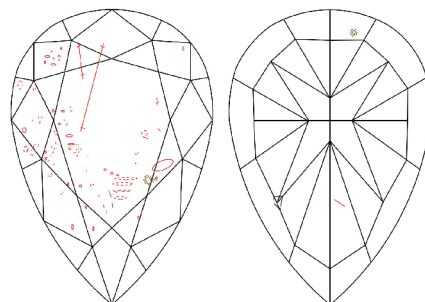
The grade '**Fancy**' represents a level with a significant presence of color and accounts for **44%** of all Grayish Yellowish Green fancy Color diamonds.

There are Five available saturation levels in Green color diamonds, Fancy being the Fourth most saturated.

THE FUNDAMENTALS OF THIS DIAMOND'S SHAPE

This **Pear** -shape's pavilion was modified from a brilliant facet alignment to optimize color retention, hence the name of this shape. Only **43%** from all Grayish Yellowish Green fancy color diamonds are polished as a Pear shape.



TRUE FACE-UP

The carat weight and physical size of a diamond are important factors in determining its value. However, when it comes to fancy colored diamonds, there is a tendency to prioritize other visual elements over their size, and as a result, the surface area of the face-up view is not always given high priority. Diamonds that appear slightly smaller are considered to be within the norm. However, diamonds that appear larger in relation to their weight will receive a premium.

THE SI2 CLARITY IN THIS FANCY GRAYISH YELLOWISH GREEN DIAMOND

Grayish Yellowish Green Fancy Color Diamonds are extremely rare in nature and achieve their value from their captivating color. Unlike colorless diamonds, the impact of low clarity in Grayish Yellowish Green fancy color diamonds is negligible as long as it is not visible to the naked eye. A Fancy Grayish Yellowish Green with a **SI2** clarity represents 17% of all Fancy Grayish Yellowish Green diamonds in the 0.70 - 0.99 carat weight category.

THE MEDIUM BLUE FLUORESCENT IN THIS DIAMOND

Fluorescence refers to the emission of visible light when a diamond is exposed to UV light. The fluorescence in this diamond is caused by the presence of trace elements within the lattice of the diamond. When a diamond is exposed to UV light, these elements absorb the energy from the UV light. They become excited, and as a result, release energy in the form of a Blue glow. The **Medium Blue** fluorescence has very little to almost no impact on the quality of this 0.88 carat diamond. In order to view the fluorescent glow, one must use a special UV device.



HOW RARE IS THIS 0.88 CARAT?

- Only **1 in ~ 990,000** diamonds will have similar characteristics
- A mere **1 to 3** similar diamonds enter the market yearly
