Gray Yellowish Green diamonds exhibit an unbelievable behavior for a diamond, as can be understood from their nickname; dramatically changing their stable color when heated or placed in darkness. Much like the mythical moonflower, which blooms at night and returns to its normal state by dawn, this transformative quality derives its value not from traditional color grades or modifiers, but from its unique ability to transform. Collectors should know that their diamonds will exhibit a different color when placed undisturbed in a safe.



A WORD ABOUT THE SATURATION OF YOUR DIAMOND

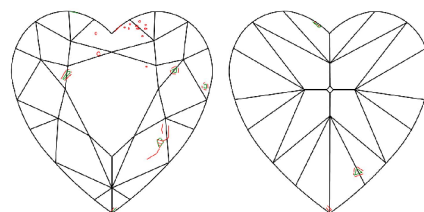
The Fancy **"Dark"** grade represents an extremely saturated and mysterious color sensation. "Dark" Gray Yellowish Green diamonds constitute just **29%** of all Gray Yellowish Green fancy color diamonds.

There are Five available saturation levels in Green color diamonds, Fancy Dark being the Five most saturated.

THE FUNDAMENTALS OF THIS DIAMOND'S SHAPE

Heart - shaped diamonds can be manufactured only from a particular shape of rough, and only skilled craftsmen can meticulously shape a rough diamond into a perfect figurative icon of love. The facets on the pavilion are inspired by the round brilliant cut, hence the name of this shape. Only **8%** of all Gray Yellowish Green fancy color diamonds are cut and polished as Heart shape.



TRUE FACE-UP

The carat weight and physical size of a diamond are important factors in determining its value. However, when it comes to fancy colored diamonds, there is a tendency to prioritize other visual elements over their size, and as a result, the surface area of the face-up view is not always given high priority.

Diamonds that appear slightly smaller are considered to be within the norm. However, diamonds that appear larger in relation to their weight will receive a premium.

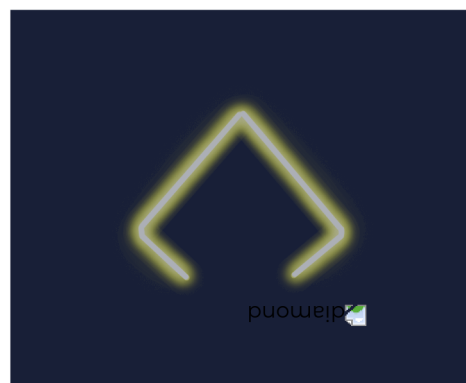
THE SI2 CLARITY IN THIS FANCY DARK GRAY YELLOWISH GREEN DIAMOND

Gray Yellowish Green Fancy Color Diamonds are extremely rare in nature and achieve their value from their captivating color. Unlike colorless diamonds, the impact of low clarity in Gray Yellowish Green fancy color diamonds is negligible as long as it is not visible to the naked eye. A Fancy Dark Gray Yellowish Green with a **SI2** clarity represents 22% of all Fancy Dark Gray Yellowish Green diamonds in the 1 - 1.49 carat weight category.

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THE MEDIUM YELLOW FLUORESCENT IN THIS DIAMOND

Fluorescence refers to the emission of visible light when a diamond is exposed to UV light. The fluorescence of this diamond is caused by the presence of trace elements within the lattice of the diamond. When a diamond is exposed to UV light, these elements absorb energy from the UV light. They become excited, and as a result, release energy in the form of a yellow glow. **Yellow fluorescence** reinforces the color of this Gray Yellowish Green diamond and will entail a price premium. The stronger the yellow fluorescence, the more attractive the diamond will be.
