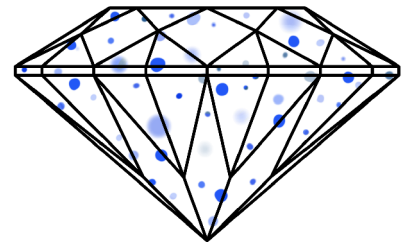

THE CAUSE OF COLOR IN YOUR GRAY BLUE DIAMOND

The **Blue and Gray** color of your 1.00 carat Cushion shape diamond has a blueprint of the ocean, as it emanates from a significant amount of boron that originated from the prehistoric ocean floor. Boron atoms lead to the absorption of yellow light, which is at the opposite end of the color spectrum from blue. In some cases hydrogen is responsible for the gray color.



A WORD ABOUT THE SATURATION OF YOUR DIAMOND

The grade '**Fancy**' represents a level with a significant presence of color and accounts for **34%** of all Gray Blue fancy Color diamonds.

There are Three available saturation levels in Blue color diamonds, Fancy being the Second most saturated.



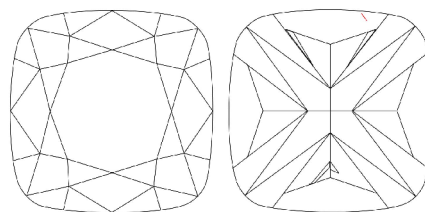

THE FUNDAMENTALS OF THIS DIAMOND'S SHAPE

The **Cushion** shape dates back to the early days when diamonds were initially made to decorate crowns of royalty. Today, the Cushion shape is still the most popular jewelry shape, and it is also yields the highest possible weight from rough diamonds. The pavilion on the bottom of your stone has a Starburst facet alignment to reinforce color reflection and brilliance. **34%** from all Gray Blue fancy color diamonds are polished as Cushion / Radiant.



TRUE FACE-UP

The carat weight and physical size of a diamond are important factors in determining its value. However, when it comes to fancy colored diamonds, there is a tendency to prioritize other visual elements over their size, and as a result, the surface area of the face-up view is not always given high priority.

Diamonds that appear slightly smaller are considered to be within the norm. However, diamonds that appear larger in relation to their weight will receive a premium.

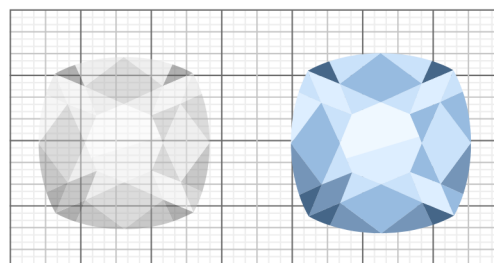

The Face-up of this 1 carat Cushion is equivalent to that of a **1.22 - 1.25 carat** which is **~23.5% larger** than the average Cushion shape in this weight.

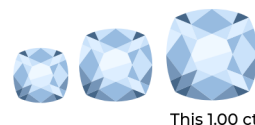

THE VS1 CLARITY IN THIS FANCY GRAY BLUE DIAMOND

Gray Blue fancy color diamonds are extremely rare in nature regardless of the saturation level. Most of natural Gray Blue diamonds are not highly included. Although a **VS** clarity grade is considered a high one, it is of less importance when factoring its impact on the value of a Gray Blue diamond. A Fancy Gray Blue with a VS clarity represents 25% of all Fancy Gray Blue diamonds in the 1 - 1.49 carat weight category.
