THE CAUSE OF COLOR IN YOUR GRAYISH GREENISH YELLOW DIAMOND

Grayish Greenish Yellow diamonds exhibit an unbelievable behavior for a diamond, as can be understood from their nickname; dramatically changing their stable color when heated or placed in darkness. Much like the mythical moonflower, which blooms at night and returns to its normal state by dawn, this transformative quality derives its value not from traditional color grades or modifiers, but from its unique ability to transform. Collectors should know that their diamonds will exhibit a different color when placed undisturbed in a safe.



A WORD ABOUT THE SATURATION OF YOUR DIAMOND

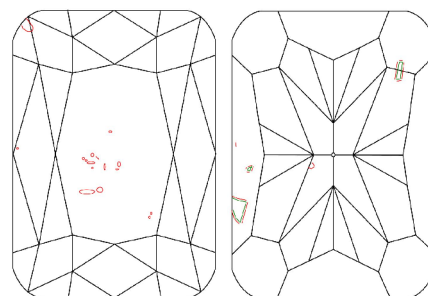
The grade '**Fancy**' represents a level with a significant presence of color and accounts for **44%** of all Grayish Greenish Yellow fancy Color diamonds.

There are Five available saturation levels in Yellow color diamonds, Fancy being the Fourth most saturated.

THE FUNDAMENTALS OF THIS DIAMOND'S SHAPE

The Cushion shape dates back to the early days when diamonds were initially used to adorn royalty's crowns. Today, it remains the most popular diamond shape in fancy color jewelry. This shape also allows for a high yield from a typical rough diamond. The pavilion at the bottom of your stone possesses a distinctive facet alignment that enhances color reflection and brilliance. With a straight outline and rounded corners in the four curved areas, it retains its unique appeal. Although the GIA does not officially classify this shape as a Cushion, it is commonly referred to as one.



TRUE FACE-UP

The carat weight and physical size of a diamond are important factors in determining its value. However, when it comes to fancy colored diamonds, there is a tendency to prioritize other visual elements over their size, and as a result, the surface area of the face-up view is not always given high priority.

Diamonds that appear slightly smaller are considered to be within the norm. However, diamonds that appear larger in relation to their weight will receive a premium.

The Face-up of this 0.44 carat Cushion is equivalent to that of a **0.47 - 0.48** carat which is **~7.8% larger** than the average Cushion shape in this weight.

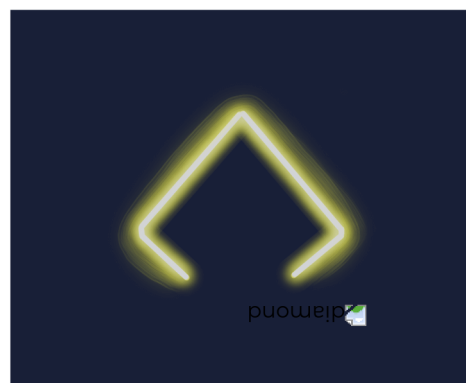
THE SI2 CLARITY IN THIS FANCY GRAYISH GREENISH YELLOW DIAMOND

Grayish Greenish Yellow Fancy Color Diamonds are extremely rare in nature and achieve their value from their captivating color. Unlike colorless diamonds, the impact of low clarity in Grayish Greenish Yellow fancy color diamonds is negligible as long as it is not visible to the naked eye. A Fancy Grayish Greenish Yellow with a **SI2** clarity represents 19% of all Fancy Grayish Greenish Yellow diamonds in the 0.31 - 0.49 carat weight category.

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THE STRONG YELLOW FLUORESCENT IN THIS DIAMOND

Fluorescence refers to the emission of visible light when a diamond is exposed to UV light. The fluorescence of this diamond is caused by the presence of trace elements within the lattice of the diamond. When a diamond is exposed to UV light, these elements absorb energy from the UV light. They become excited, and as a result, release energy in the form of a yellow glow. **Yellow** fluorescence reinforces the color of this Grayish Greenish Yellow diamond and will entail a price premium. The stronger the yellow fluorescence, the more attractive the diamond will be.
