THE CAUSE OF COLOR IN YOUR YELLOW DIAMOND

The **Yellow** color of your natural 2.03 carat, Fancy Light Yellow is attributed to a significant concentration of nitrogen atoms within its structure. These atoms absorb blue light, giving the diamond its distinct yellow hue. The intensity of the yellow color increases with the concentration of nitrogen in the diamond. Therefore, a higher concentration of nitrogen results in a more vibrant yellow appearance.



A WORD ABOUT THE SATURATION OF YOUR DIAMOND

The grade "**Fancy Light**" represents **34%** of all Yellow fancy Color diamonds. Although referred to as "Fancy Light", these diamonds may exhibit a prominent hue, transcending color effectively

There are Four available saturation levels in Yellow color diamonds, Fancy Light being the First most saturated.

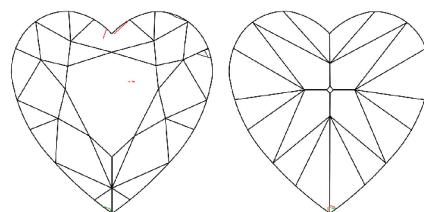

THE FUNDAMENTALS OF THIS DIAMOND'S SHAPE

Heart - shaped diamonds can be manufactured only from a particular shape of rough, and only skilled craftsmen can meticulously shape a rough diamond into a perfect figurative icon of love. The facets on the pavilion are inspired by the round brilliant cut, hence the name of this shape. Only **7%** of all Yellow fancy color diamonds are cut and polished as Heart shape.



TRUE FACE-UP

The carat weight and physical size of a diamond are important factors in determining its value. However, when it comes to fancy colored diamonds, there is a tendency to prioritize other visual elements over their size, and as a result, the surface area of the face-up view is not always given high priority. Diamonds that appear slightly smaller are considered to be within the norm. However, diamonds that appear larger in relation to their weight will receive a premium.

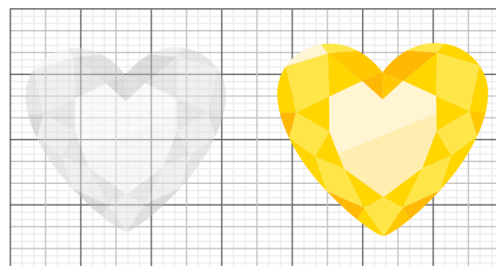

The Face-up of this 2.03 carat Heart is equivalent to that of a **2.03 - 2.08** carat which is **~1.2% larger** than the average Heart shape in this weight.

THE SI1 CLARITY IN THIS FANCY LIGHT YELLOW DIAMOND

The impact of the **SI1** clarity, in a Fancy Light Yellow, Heart cut, is negligible compared to colorless diamonds especially when it is not visible to the naked eye. The SI1 clarity grade represents 13% of all Fancy Light Yellow diamonds in the 2 - 2.99 carat weight category.

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THE MEDIUM BLUE FLUORESCENT IN THIS DIAMOND

Fluorescence refers to the emission of visible light when a diamond is exposed to UV light. The fluorescence in this diamond is caused by the presence of trace elements within the lattice of the diamond. When a diamond is exposed to UV light, these elements absorb the energy from the UV light. They become excited, and as a result, release energy in the form of a Blue glow. The **Medium Blue** fluorescence has very little to almost no impact on the quality of this 2.03 carat diamond. In order to view the fluorescent glow, one must use a special UV device.



HOW RARE IS THIS 2.03 CARAT?

- Only **1 in ~ 190,000** diamonds will have similar characteristics
- A mere **9 to 12** similar diamonds enter the market yearly
