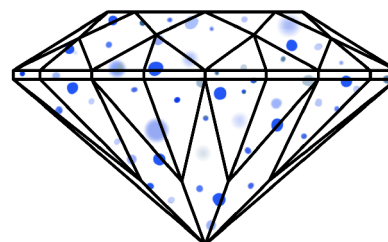

THE CAUSE OF COLOR IN YOUR GRAY BLUE DIAMOND

The **Blue and Gray** color of your 0.29 carat Round shape diamond has a blueprint of the ocean, as it emanates from a significant amount of boron that originated from the prehistoric ocean floor. Boron atoms lead to the absorption of yellow light, which is at the opposite end of the color spectrum from blue. In some cases hydrogen is responsible for the gray color.



A WORD ABOUT THE SATURATION OF YOUR DIAMOND

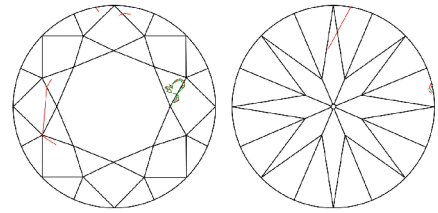
The grade "**Fancy Light**" represents **52%** of all Gray Blue fancy Color diamonds. Although referred to as "Fancy Light", these diamonds may exhibit a prominent hue, transcending color effectively

There are Three available saturation levels in Blue color diamonds, Fancy Light being the First most saturated.



THE FUNDAMENTALS OF THIS DIAMOND'S SHAPE

Your 0.29 carat **round** brilliant cut diamond is cut and polished with the same facet alignment and an angle of colorless diamonds. fancy color **round** diamonds do not retain color the way modified fancy shapes do and as such, are rarely seen in weights above 0.10 carat. **round** fancy color diamonds in the Intense or Vivid grade fetch a significant premium in comparison to similar diamonds in other shapes. TRUE FACE-UP

The carat weight and physical size of a diamond are important factors in determining its value. However, when it comes to fancy colored diamonds, there is a tendency to prioritize other visual elements over their size, and as a result, the surface area of the face-up view is not always given high priority. Diamonds that appear slightly smaller are considered to be within the norm. However, diamonds that appear larger in relation to their weight will receive a premium.

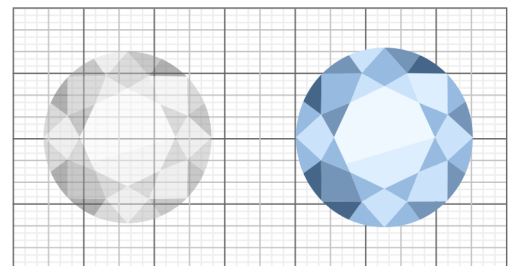

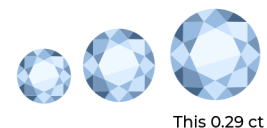

THE SI2 CLARITY IN THIS FANCY LIGHT GRAY BLUE DIAMOND

Gray Blue Fancy Color Diamonds are extremely rare in nature and achieve their value from their captivating color. Unlike colorless diamonds, the impact of low clarity in Gray Blue fancy color diamonds is negligible as long as it is not visible to the naked eye. A Fancy Light Gray Blue with a **SI2** clarity represents 13% of all Fancy Light Gray Blue diamonds in the 0 - 0.30 carat weight category.
