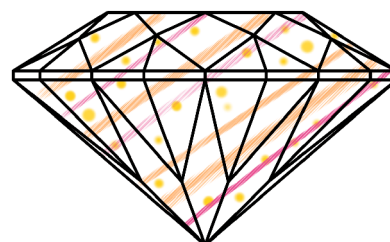

The combination of the pink and brown hue of your Fancy **Brown Pink** 1.11 carat diamond is caused by a fascinating geological phenomenon that occurs when certain diamonds undergo more forcible pressure and heat than others. Diamonds that are exposed to 900° Celsius and manage to withstand the immense pressure underground experience a unique change in their atomic alignment. That's when the magic happens! Scientists believe that when light enters your Fancy Brown Pink Radiant diamond and crosses its special atomic distortion, the light rays bend at an angle that absorbs a wide range of the color spectrum of light and creating the brown color, which will result in a combination of brown and pink color sensation.



A WORD ABOUT THE SATURATION OF YOUR DIAMOND

The grade '**Fancy**' represents a level with a significant presence of color and accounts for **49%** of all Brown Pink fancy Color diamonds.

There are Three available saturation levels in Pink color diamonds, Fancy being the Second most saturated.



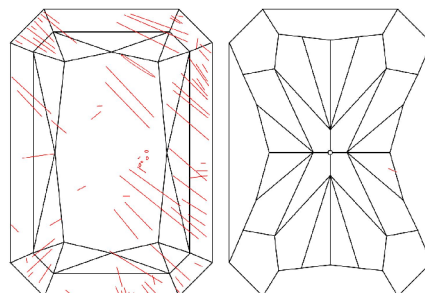

THE FUNDAMENTALS OF THIS DIAMOND'S SHAPE

The **Radiant** cut is a square or rectangular diamond with clipped corners, usually polished with a minimum of 59 facets. The Radiant is polished with a Starburst style pavilion, inspired by a round brilliant cut diamond, hence the name of this shape. **28%** from all Brown Pink fancy color diamonds are polished as Cushion / Radiant.



TRUE FACE-UP

The carat weight and physical size of a diamond are important factors in determining its value. However, when it comes to fancy colored diamonds, there is a tendency to prioritize other visual elements over their size, and as a result, the surface area of the face-up view is not always given high priority.

Diamonds that appear slightly smaller are considered to be within the norm. However, diamonds that appear larger in relation to their weight will receive a premium.

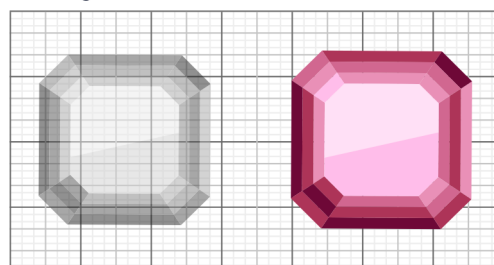

The Face-up of this 1.11 carat Radiant is equivalent to that of a **1.22 - 1.24 carat** which is **~10.7% larger** than the average Radiant shape in this weight.

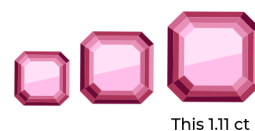

THE SI1 CLARITY IN THIS FANCY BROWN PINK DIAMOND

Most Brown Pink fancy color diamonds are formed under greater underground pressure relative to other diamonds. As such, many Brown Pink rough diamonds are heavily fractured and cracked and as a result, receive a low clarity grade. Perusing a high clarity grade during the manufacturing process usually entails a significant weight loss. Fancy Brown Pink diamonds with **SI1** clarity grade are bought widely and represent 29% of all Fancy Brown Pink diamonds in the 1 - 1.49 carat weight category.
